I can bring a small bag that can fit under my seat.


I can bring a debit or credit card to buy drinks at the bar.

I can bring my phone with the email. I can screenshot my ticket. I can print my ticket.


The address for Town Hall is 90-130 Swanston St Melbourne 3000. I can get to Town Hall by train, tram, or car.

The closest train station is Flinders **Street Station.**

The closest tram stops are Stop 6 **Collins Street, and Stop 10 Swanston** St.







When I arrive, I will check my ticket for the correct door to enter and then join the queue.


If I need help, I can ask a staff member. They are wearing red t-shirts and lanyards.

There are 3 entrances to Town Hall.

There are two entrances on Swanston Street. There is one entrance on Collins Street.

If I'm not sure which entrance to use, I can ask a staff member for help.





There may be lots of people outside Town Hall. It might be very loud and busy.

I can wear headphones or ear plugs if I want.

There will be someone at the door to scan my ticket before I enter.

I may need to wait in line to have my ticket scanned.







If I have a bag, I may be asked to open it by a security guard. This is to help keep everyone safe.

Melbourne Town Hall has assistive listening devices with headphones available that can be borrowed for shows in Main Hall and Lower Town Hall.

I can ask a staff member for help with assistive listening devices.








There may be lots of other people in the venue. It may be crowded and loud. There may be background music.

If I need to sit down, I can ask a staff member to help me find somewhere to sit.



There are accessible bathrooms on the ground floor and the third floor. I can get to these using the lift.

If I need help finding a bathroom, I can ask a staff member.

I can get water for free from beside the bar.










The doors to the theatre will open a few minutes before the show starts. It is different for every show.

I will try to be at the venue at least ten minutes before the show time on my ticket.

A staff member will check my ticket at the door, and let me in. If there are assigned seats, a staff member will tell me where to sit.

If there are no assigned seats, I can sit wherever I want, but I might get asked to sit somewhere specific by staff, especially if the room is not very full.





When I get into the room, there may be people talking, and there may be music playing.

There may be lights moving or shining towards me.


When the show is about to start, the ceiling lights will turn off and it will get darker.

When the show starts, there may be loud music that plays.

The artist will come out to start the show, and people may clap.







Throughout the show, I will hear lots of different jokes. There may be music or visual jokes as well.

Throughout the show people will laugh and clap. I can laugh and clap as well if I want too.

At the end of the show, the ceiling lights will come on, and it will be time to leave.

There will be lots of other people leaving at the same time as me.
